

Our members work on teams, help run events, care for our children, play instruments, facilitate Life Groups, landscape, serve communion, build furniture, visit the sick, fix cars, write to shut-ins, cook meals for new moms, build props, clean up our schools, brew coffee, pray for one another daily, and much, much more...
